Thanksgiving is behind, Christmas 2022 is past and now we are beginning another New Year.

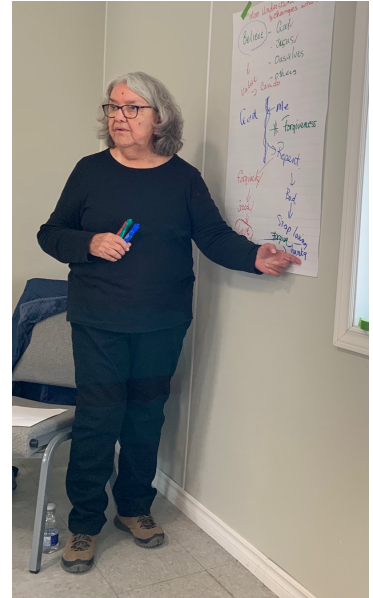
